MINUTES TO REGULAR MEETING

Mangers Report – Cyndi Thomas –

- Pool Opened on Saturday. The attendance is good. There were only 2 vending machines for the weekend but the remaining 4 are being delivered at this time. The Chemicals are having a minor difficulty but that too is being fixed.
- Ichor Airsoft will be using and maintaining the Mud Run field with some improvements in the works.
- June 18th is Movie Night. This will be free to all and will start at 7PM. There will be popcorn and other snacks and water.
- July 4th is scheduled for July 3rd at Old Home Manor. This event will be free and everyone is encouraged to bring their own ice chest, munchies, and refreshments along with seating in chairs or blankets but no canopies. You can also sit in the back of your truck if you like.
There was some discussion about a laser show if we could not have fireworks. It was discovered that you really need an extremely high, huge screen to get the desired effect. We were informed that Colorado has a large net they use and it works well.
Also discussed was a Drone Light Show like the one held at the Olympics. It was pointed out that we now have a drone manufacturer locally and maybe this is something they might be interested in.
- Aug 14th is a Lunch Truck event at Memory Park. There are already 11 trucks signed up for this event. There will be no entrance fee but you are requested to buy something from a truck to eat or drink.

Old Business

Mud Run: The Mud Run will be Oct. 2nd. Carrie will be setting up the computer and online system. This will take about 30 days to be live. The subject was brought up that according to the article in this week's Review, The Grinder offers a break for early reservation but you do not have to pay for it until 30 days out. The thought was that maybe this would help people make reservations early instead of waiting until the last minute. If we had a better idea of how many were going to show up maybe we could have a better strategy in setting up our runners. It was also said that the Grinder does their own entries, not a computer company giving more options having to do with entries. Our present computer company does not offer this option.

New Business

Wind and Kite Festival – David brought this to the table a few months ago and it was tabled. It was brought back up and he defined the event as encompassing anything that is moved by wind. The event would probably be held at Old Home Manor. The event could include old windmills with help from the Historical Society to bring in CV or windmill history. Maybe kite vendors or other interested parties and food trucks. There would be kite competitions and kite building. Some of the events could include youngest, largest, oldest, most colorful, and more. This type of event has been exceedingly popular and has become a destination event in other states but nothing in AZ or neighboring states that we could find. It was felt with a little more information this could be a great event for the whole family and an asset to CV.
