Senior Facilities Maintenance Pool Operator

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Education and Experience:

High school graduation or equivalency.

Required Licenses or Certifications:

Possession of a valid State of Arizona driver's license.

Hazardous Chemical Handling and OSHA Respiratory Protection Training within 6 months of hire. Certified Pool Operator from National Swimming Pool Foundation within 6 months of hire. Chlorine Safe Handling Certificate from Occupational Safety and Health Administration within 6 months of hire.

Required Knowledge of:

- Pool safety practices, procedures, rules and regulations.
- Understands and supports the mechanical operations of pool equipment (pumps, chemical systems, pool vacuums, gas heaters, etc.), including repair and maintenance of equipment.
- Methods, procedures, materials, tools and equipment used in the maintenance, cleaning, and repair of swimming pools.
- Proper methods for storing and handling equipment, materials, and supplies.
- Proper storage, use, and disposal of hazardous chemicals.
- Ability and knowledge of local and OSHA safety regulations and requirements while working in enclosed spaces and with hazardous chemicals and gases.
- Principals of water flow.
- General knowledge of plumbing, electrical, and HVAC systems for routine maintenance and repair.
- General knowledge of irrigation and landscape maintenance equipment use and repair.
- Health and Safety regulations related to assigned activities.
- Proper chemistry, bacteria levels, and pH of swimming pool water.
- Uses and applications of personal computers and various software applications.
- Oral and written communication skills.
- Record keeping techniques.
- Safe work practices.

Required Ability to:

- Maintain public pools to meet all applicable health regulations.
- Operate pool chemical testing equipment and handle chemicals related to pool maintenance.
- Complete daily chemical logs. Keep chemicals balanced.
- Respond to emergency callouts or situations as needed.
- Maintain written records.
- Inspect, clean and repair tools and equipment related to pool equipment, facilities maintenance, and landscape maintenance.
- Use of a variety of hand and power tools.
- Uses portable electronics and personal computers and various software applications.
- Communicate effectively, orally, electronically, and in writing.
- Make sound judgement and decisions based on the interpretation of data.

Physical Demands / Work Environment:

- Work requires heavy physical exertion and effort. Forces exerted are equivalent to lifting between 25 and 50 pounds. The need for physical stamina and endurance is great. The degree of physical strain produced on the job is high. It results in fatigue, and requires periods of rest. Job requirements for manual dexterity and physical manipulation are high. Work could involve the coordination of body movements involving various body postures.

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- Exposure to physical hazards, health and safety risks, adverse or otherwise undesirable characteristics in the environment such as laboratory or warehouse, machinery vibration and noise, and hazardous chemicals. Personal risks require use of safety equipment or following precautions closely.
- Responsible for personal performance as a source of serious safety risk. Work involves the use of hazardous tools, equipment and/or materials OR ensuring organizational compliance with rules, procedures and legislation for safe operation of facility.
