DEPARTMENT POLICIES



- DEPARTMENT POLICIES ARE CREATED AND MAINTAINED BY LEXIPOL
- LEXIPOL TRACKS AND UPDATES POLICIES TO ENSURE THEY ARE STATE SPECIFIC AND REFLECT ALL LEGISLATIVE CHANGES AND/OR UPDATES.
- LEXIPOL'S POLICY MANAGEMENT MEETS ACCREDITATION NEEDS FOR AGENCIES.
- OFFICERS MUST REVIEW AND ACKNOWLEDGE ALL POLICY UPDATES AS THEY ARE ISSUED. CVPD HAS RECEIVED THE GOLD LEXIPOL AWARD THE PAST THREE YEARS.
- OFFICERS ARE ASSIGNED A MONTHLY POLICY REVIEW PACKAGE, WHICH THEY HAVE TO COMPLETE BY THE END OF THE MONTH. THE REVIEWS INCLUDE SCENARIOS AND TESTS TO ENSURE UNDERSTANDING OF ISSUED POLICIES.

ARIZONA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACCREDITATION PROGRAM (ALEAP)

IN 2018, THE ARIZONA ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE, ARIZONA MUNICIPAL RISK RETENTION POOL, LEAGUE OF ARIZONA CITIES AND TOWN AND ARIZONA POST ENTERED INTO A UNIQUE PARTNERSHIP TO DEVELOP STANDARDS OF BEST PRACTICES FOR THE SAFE, EFFECTIVE, EFFICIENT AND NON-DISCRIMINATORY DELIVERY OF PROFESSIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES TO ALL RESIDENTS AND VISITORS OF ARIZONA.



What is Accreditation?

A systematic method of conducting a detailed internal review of law enforcement agencies policies, procedures, operations and training

A **voluntary** program to provide public and professional recognition to those agencies who prove independent assessors that they meet or exceed the rigorous standards of the program.

Goals of Accreditation

Formalize essential management procedures for greater accountability

Establish **fair and non-discriminatory** personnel practices

Improve service delivery to all Arizona communities

Build **community trust and confidence** in their police department

STANDARD COMPLIANCE, DIRECTIVES, PROOFS OF COMPLIANCE, MOCK ASSESSMENT

THE ON-SITE ASSESSMENT PHASE

TWO ASSESSORS, TWO DAYS, VERBAL AND WRITTEN REPORTS

THE COMMISSION HEARING / DECISION PHASE

HEARING, AWARD PRESENTATION
