PARADE RULES

(Keep For Your Records)

- The Parade will take place regardless of weather, so be prepared. Weather in Chino Valley is unpredictable.
- Entries should conform to the Parade theme, “**Happy Birthday Chino Valley**” and be appropriate for a mixed audience. Any entry deemed offensive will be excluded from the event.
- A representative of each entry must register at the registration table between 8:00 am and 9:00 am. at Heritage Middle School, 1076 Road 1 North. Please be certain that the person registering at the Parade has received the specifics about the Parade from the person completing the Parade application form. This eliminates a lot of confusion on Parade day.
- All entries must display their names, and entry numbers must be visible to the judges. Entry numbers will be distributed at registration.
- Alcohol is not permitted in the Parade or in the staging areas. Anyone intoxicated will be asked to leave the event.
- All entries with live animals must supply their own “pooper scoopers.” Scoopers must follow their entry and have adequate equipment for clean-up.
- Entrants may distribute “goodies” to Parade spectators. Things, however, should not be passed out in a way that might pose a safety risk to the crowd.
- Entrants are encouraged to perform for the judges. Performances should last no longer than 60 seconds each. A performance for the judges will be the only stop allowed.
- Political entrants are welcome. They must provide their own vehicles, and their entries should conform to the Parade theme.
- Live or taped music is welcomed and encouraged. The music should, however, be consistent with the entry and the theme.
- Be creative and have fun! Help celebrate Chino Valley's territorial history!
